## A Nurturing Environment

At Perrott Hill, we aim to provide a nurturing environment where our boarders are safely cared for by a supportive team of dedicated staff. The school was formerly a family home to the Hoskyns family and we have six sets of staff and their families living onsite, which adds to the 'home from home' ethos we're known and loved for. We know that our boarders find fun and happiness at the heart of their boarding experience and this allows them to become confident, independent and resilient individuals who are ready for their senior school life and beyond.

# Flexible Options

with full boarding being available from Year 5 (9+). Full boarders are cared for seven nights a week, but leave the school to stay with family, guardians or friends for exeats, half term and holidays. Weekly boarders sign up for a minimum of four nights during the week and can increase this to five nights at no extra cost. Like full boarders, weekly boarders have their own bed in the same dorm for a term. Regular boarders stay for one, two or three nights a week, booked in advance; while flexi boarders can book ad hoc beds subject to availability.

# Academic and Music Support

Our day and boarding staff work together to provide the best possible outcomes for our pupils. As well as academic support for Upper Prep pupils, our boarding staff are on hand to support boarders with their music and performing arts practice, including supervised practice time on weekday mornings. Our Director of Music, Mr Shortman, meets with the boarders at the start of each term to draw up a suitable practice schedule which is then shared with parents and displayed in the dorms. In addition, we have a quiet room with computer access for pupils wishing to further their studies.

### A True Family Ethos

The boys' dorms – called the Boys' Den – are located in the main house, at the top of the Grundy staircase and across the hall from the Headmaster's Study. The girls' dorms – called the Girls' Den – are located in the main house, next to the Surgery. There are additional dorms at the top of the main house – called The Loft – and this is where our year group Loft Nights are held. Each room has between four and eight beds.

# Boarding Responsibilities

Boarders are nominated to represent the boarding community on various committees held termly, such as the food and IT committees. We have a suggestion box in each dorm where children can write down, in confidence, anything they want to feed back to staff. In addition, we have roles of responsibility including Boarding Captains and Boarding Buddies and we thoroughly enjoy seeing our boarders step up into these roles.

### Strong Communication

Communication between school and home is encouraged and the boarders have ample opportunities in the evenings to phone or Facetime home and keep in touch. We have plenty of quiet, privates spaces for the children to call home, plus phones on each of the girls' and boys' landing along with the boarding mobile. Boarding staff keep in regular contact with parents and we post stories and photographs on social media, in The Week Ahead and in our termly Review magazine!

# Frequently Asked Questions

#### What happens if my child is ill?

We will contact you if you child is ill, but rest assured they will be in safe hands! Your child will be monitored and cared for by both our School Nurse, Mrs Manley, and Boarding Matron, Mrs Tarrant, unless it is felt that they need to go home to recover. We have a dedicated Surgery with two individual rooms with beds and we have access to a doctor where necessary.

#### What does my child need to bring?

Kit lists will be sent out well in advance, but the most important thing is to make your dorm as homely as possible. Boarders are encouraged to bring their own duvet covers, pictures and posters, a teddy and their favourite book.

# What activities take place at the weekends?

We have a full programme of weekend activities, which are open to boarders and non-boarders and are published at the start of each term. Activities include things like dry slope skiing, go karting, paddle boarding and kayaking, so there is always plenty to do! We ask the boarders' for their suggestions too.

#### How much does it cost?

The fees for full, weekly (4+ nights) and regular (1-3 nights) boarding can be viewed on our website which you can access **here**.

# The Boarding Routine

#### Weekdays

- 0710 Wake up! Make beds, brush teeth, uniform on.
- 0730 An optional supervised music practice session for boarders receiving instrumental or performing arts lessons.
- 0740 Breakfast. There are different choices each day, from pastries to a full English, and there is always cereal, fruit, toast and fresh juices.
- 0810 We say Grace to start the day and then boarders head to their form rooms ready for school to start at 0820.
- 1745 The school day ends. Boarders go to the dorms to get changed into mufti. Dirty uniform goes in the wash!
- 1800 Supper in the dining room, supervised by teaching staff.
- 1830 Activity time until 1930. There is a choice of activities each evening and there is always a sporty and a non-sporty option. These are led by teaching staff and grads.
- 1930 Back into the dining room for a bedtime snack. Tuck is allowed twice a week! Boarding staff take over from this point onwards.
- 1945 Up to the dorms for showers and change into pjs. Boarders tend to chat about their day with the house staff and get organised for the next morning. Evening routines vary: sometimes we have a few games all together, other times we chill out and watch a film or read a bedtime story. Children are encouraged to phone home during this time to say hello, using the school phone or the boarding mobile.
- 2015 Bedtime routines start, with quiet reading in bed and staggered bedtimes for all the children. Our youngest pupils in Year 3 have their lights out by 2030, while for our Year 8 pupils its lights out by 2115.

#### Weekends

#### Saturday

- 1600 School finishes at 1600 on Saturday (unless you have a late match) so from 1600-1745 you have some free time to relax, call home and play with friends.
- 1745 Get changed into mufti.
- 1800 Supper. Either in the Dining Hall, or we may go out for fish and chips on the beach or pizza and film night! Saturday nights are very much boarders' choice so are very flexible.
- 2030 Staggered bedtimes starting from 2030.

#### Sunday

- 0900 A lie in! We have a very relaxed breakfast at around 0900.
- 1000 Back up to the dorms to get dressed, before making use of the common rooms and school grounds for some fun.
- 1100 The weekend activity programme starts.
- 1730 Supper with Mr and Mrs McCullough.
- 1930 Back to the dorms for showers and to get ready for the busy week ahead.
- 2015 The bedtime routines begin.

# Further Information and Booking

To book a full, weekly or regular bed, please email Mrs Layfield on elayfield@perrotthill.com. There has been a slight change in regular and flexi boarding this term and the following information may be useful.

- Full boarding is for children in Years 5-8 and enables a pupil to board seven nights a week and take part in all activities;
- Weekly boarding is a minimum of four nights per week, Monday to Friday, for children in Years 3-8. Any boarding activities during the week are included. Pupils are welcome to stay on weekends at an additional cost, but pupils in Years 3 and 4 will need to be collected at 0820 on Saturday morning (or at 1000 if they are staying for the optional Saturday morning sports club);
- Regular boarding is for pupils in Years 3-8, is billed termly and is for a set number
  of nights per week, between one and three. This is not a flexible arrangement –
  but if a boarding activity falls on that evening the cost of the activity is included.
  The cost for regular boarding is £44 per night;
- Flexi boarding can be booked online via a link in The Week Ahead (or by emailing elayfield@perrotthill.com if less than 24 hours' notice). There may be additional charges incurred for boarding activities. The cost for flexi boarding is £45 per night.
